EXPLANATION.

ON Monday, June the 22d, 1795, at half past 2 A. M. the English Fleet, under Lord Bridport, saw the French, and gave Chase; but there being only a light Air of Wind, it was not until Tuesday the 23d, at 54 minutes past 5 o'Clock, A. M. that the Queen Charlotte, Orion, and the Irresistible, being the advanced Ships, began their Fire upon the Rear of the Enemy, without shortning Sail, having received the Enemy's Fire some Time before. At this Period, Eleven Sail of the French Line could bring, from their whole Broadside, others only their Stern Guns, to bear upon the advanced Ships.—See Plan No. 1.—About a Quarter of an Hour afterwards, the Sans Pareil, Ruffel, and Colossus, were sufficiently up to Engage. At 20 minutes past 6 o'Clock A. M. the Formidable took Fire, and surrendered. At a Quarter past 7, the Alexander struck her Colours.—See Plan No. 2, which is about 5 minutes previous to the Time represented.—At about Half past 8, the Royal George cut off the Retreat of the Tigre, which struck her Colours, and the Battle ended.—See Plan No. 3.

The Wind was light, and in different Direction, the Ships in the Rear having it abast the Beam, while it headed the Ships as they drew near the Shore.

N. B. This is the same French Fleet, which chased Admiral Cornwallis, and this Painting may be considered, as the Sequel to that Exhibiting now in the Upper Circle in the PANORAMA.
